Shounak Das and Aryanil Sarkar have made us proud by qualifying for NTSE scholarship conducted by National Council of Educational Research and Training and KVPY Scholarship Award 2020. In addition to it, Harshul Singh I A, Triyan I C, Pranshi Singh III C and Shounak Das XII B won state level Awards in Science Olympiads in January 2021. Also, Tejas Anand I C, Triyan I C, Ahaan I D, Darsh Jain II A, Heeti Marwari II A, Aneshya Das IX D, Atishay Jain XI D, Akash Srikanth and Shounak Das XII B won state Level awards in Maths Olympiads held in January 2021.

Due to the covid-19 pandemic, the school has been working online since the beginning of the new academic session. Nevertheless, the school teachers have been carrying out all their duties timely rising to the new challenges and incorporating technology as per the requirements.

This year presented several challenges as the normal classroom teaching was replaced by online teaching. E-classes for the students were conducted using Skype, Zoom, WhatsApp and Google meet applications. Learning content in the form of tutorials, assignments, worksheets, books, notes, presentations, digital question banks, YouTube links, audios, videos, animations etc. were shared with students on class WhatsApp groups, Snap homework application and through Google drive links. Parents were counseled on their queries pertaining to the learning material prepared by the teachers. Students were given access to the content and online courses provided by Extramarks, Aavishkar & Diksha by CBSE & e-pathshala.

On July 10, 2020 an orientation programme was held by IT department of Mehta Vidyalaya via zoom meeting for all staff members on using G- Suite Platform for effective teaching. G-suite has better connectivity and high privacy, works faster, has unlimited storage and data security and is cost effective. It is a cloud-based platform and comes with unlimited storage for files, documents and emails. Teachers were trained on the G – Suite platform for smooth conduct of the online classes.

Besides this, the school conducted all activities and competitions on the online platform which had been planned at the starting of the academic session. All events like SAS Camp for Class XI, Earth day, Munshi Memorial Inter School Recitation and Lilawati Munshi Painting Competition, Dewang Mehta Memorial IT Inter school Competition, Independence Day, Teachers' Day, Janmashtami Celebrations, Spic Macay, Vanmohotsav, Investiture ceremony, Parents' orientation programmes etc. were all conducted online with full zeal and enthusiasm.

Skill development activities like drawing, painting, craft, dance, vocal music, instrumental music, robotics, wood craft as well as sports, games and yoga were taught through videos and online classes on Zoom and Google meet. Students participated in "Fit India" movement organised by CBSE.

Regular counseling sessions are held for students and parents on various relevant topics like career mapping, handling loneliness especially during lockdown, time management, emotional intelligence, stress management, dealing with anxiety etc. These sessions are taken by the School Counselor and various guest speakers from respective fields.

The school is also committed to make educational process inclusive of Value Education and Life skills. The school is also associated with Ramakrishna Mission by incorporating Awakened Citizen and Life skill Programme. This programme facilitates in engaging the students to undertake practical exercises which help them to get greater clarity and consciousness through 'Self Reflection'.

During the covid-19 pandemic, Ramakrishna mission launched the digital version of the ACP programme that could be shared via online platforms with students.

Cultural Exchange Program broadens students' perspective of the world. Under the umbrella of ICEP, our students have been exposed to new learning perspectives as well as opportunities, to develop an adaptability to embrace new cultures and to promote liberal mindset. 
code of conduct for students and parents and various co-curricular activities were highlighted.




INDO-JAPAN PARTNERSHIP



During their two-day visit, the assessors were given a virtual tour of the school infrastructure which included labs, library, classes, toilets, playground, etc. Their main focus was around our stringent controls on Health and Security of students and staff members. It was followed by assessing the key domain(s) namely, School Governance; Education & Support process; and; Performance Measurement & Improvement. The assessors interacted with the respective process owners and went through the documentation maintained by each process.

They provided their valuable feedback on Quality Objectives to the respective process owners. They also appreciated the school's infrastructure and the highly energetic teaching staff.

The final physical visit was conducted on **March 16 – 17, 2022** to check the smooth implementation of NABET assessment. Dr. S.C. Kaushik was the Lead assessor and Dr. B. Singh was the Co-assessor for the accreditation process.

The assessors went on rounds for the observation of functioning of labs and interacted with lab in charges, followed by observation of school infrastructure and learning environment. Then, the team of assessors advanced to complaint handling committee, action research team, feedback committee, SWOT, School Office functioning, Physical Education department. They also looked into the key findings of the internal audit done in the school and discussed about the Accreditation Manual, Mission of the school, Quality objectives and afterwards they surveyed the dispersal of students.



The Assessors and the respective process owners of Admissions, Human Resources and Transport department interacted with the parents/ stakeholders. The Assessors communicated with the senior students of the school about the significant role of school in their overall growth. Then the Administrative department of the school was visited by the Assessors and the suggestions were given to improve the functioning. Thereafter, a visit to school library was done. Financial Resources; Examination and Assessment; Ethical values, continual improvement; Self-Assessment



and Compliance with CBSE requirements were discussed and their valuable points were taken and noted by the process owners for future reference. The two days physical visit by QCI (NABET) culminated with a brief discussion with all the process owners and the school administration by the Assessors.




QCI Briefing Report

An Online meeting was conducted by Mrs. Dimple Juneja, QCI Coordinator in the presence of Dr. (Mrs.) Anju Tandon, Principal, BVBMV and Mrs. Alka Jayaswal, Vice Principal for all Heads of the Department and the teachers of Nursery classes to XII on October 08, 2021.



The Core Team members of QCI presented the Mission and Vision statement, SOPs, Quality Check of processes (SWOT, PDCA Review Meeting), and Master List. The members explained the three Smart Quality Objectives selected by the committee, i.e. Intellectual development, creative expression and environmental sensitivity. 
HAPPINESS CURRICULUM SESSION 2022







75TH INDEPENDENCE DAY CELEBRATION



The Mock drill was conducted with the aim of preparing students in case of a disaster. It trains them to follow certain Do's and Don'ts in case of a disaster, which always comes unexpectedly. It is the mock drills that when practiced helps one to face the situation with confidence.



This was the first Online Mock drill since current Pandemic situation to create awareness about Do's and Don'ts during Earthquake situation in the home scenario.


GANDHI JAYANTI CELEBRATION

A special assembly was conducted for the students of classes III to VIII. A PowerPoint presentation on glimpses of Gandhiji's life and philosophy was






In Conversation with Prof. Siddharth Ramji

Virtual Interaction With Padmashri Santosh Yadav



The competition consists of 10 colourful interactive mathematical tasks. The tasks on logical and spatial thinking help the child to move away from rote learning.






Winner certificates were awarded to the children who scored maximum points and solved all the tasks in shortest possible time. Each participant and all coordinating teachers received an E-certificate.


Students of class V collected pictures and information on the topic - "Dussehra Celebration in Sikkim" and made a chart on this theme.

REPORT ON VIGILANCE AWARENESS WEEK 2021


The Vigilance Awareness Week is observed every year across India to promote integrity in public life and achieve a corruption free society.






video by Korean Taekwondo Academy presenting the stunts of Taekwondo was showcased.





Awakened Citizen Program (ACP)



Students of class III made Christmas cards with beautiful messages, class IV students decorated the Christmas trees and class V students made photo frames with Christmas as a theme.





Activities Commemorating Kulapati K M Munshiji's Birth Anniversary (Founder's Day)

Herbal Garden



activities were planned and coordinated by the School Herbal Garden Team.






AWARENESS GENERATION PROGRAMME CONDUCTED BY ENERGY CONSERVATION CLUB








National Reading Day

During pandemic times, education has changed dramatically, with the distinctive rise of e-learning, whereby teaching is undertaken remotely and on digital platforms.




The department instills creativity in various work experience subjects like Drawing, Dance, Vocal Music, Instrumental Music, Craft, Robotics, Band, Tabla and Woodcraft.

At the very onset of the curricular training the primary students are introduced to the various art forms such as dance, music, clay, craft and drawing. As the students graduate to class 6th, they choose their preferred work experience, and learn the skill till class 10th. This develops a vocational skill in them which can be taken up later as a passion or as a profession.








HUG WITH WARMTH








BASANT PANCHAMI CELEBRATION



गर्मी का कहर


