

> Session on Understanding the Concept of Learning Disability










Hubs of Learning







Department Activities Related To COVID-19

English Department

On 3rd May, students of class III were given the task of writing a paragraph, making a collage of their activities and also making a video on how they were keeping themselves busy and occupied during the period of lockdown.

On 6th & 7th May respectively, students of Classes IV and V were asked to record a video and write a paragraph on how this period of lockdown has taught them to be self-reliant and assist their parents in daily household work. Students of class IV shared how they had helped their family members in the daily routine household work, while the students of class V shared some of the habits inculcated by them to safeguard themselves from the deadly corona virus.

Students of classes VI and VII were given the task of writing a diary entry. In class VI the activity was conducted on 4th and 8th May respectively while in Class VII the activity was conducted on 24th April. Painting Competition







