It is my honour to present the Annual Report 2022-23, which documents the progress and achievements of our school, under the guidance of the most positive brains at Delhi Kendra and homogeneous efforts from our Vice-Principal, Smt. Jagriti Sharma, the hardworking teaching, non-teaching, and administrative colleagues and our role model parents, our children who received accolades throughout the year for the talents they possess in academics and co-curricular activities.

This year, in Class X, out of the 148 students who appeared, 21 students passed with 90% and above, and 109 students passed with 1st division leaving 18 students with 2nd Division.

In Class XII, out of the 146 students who appeared, 25 students passed with 90% and above, 115 students passed with 1st division leaving 6 students with 2nd division. **Pranjali Kapoor** topped with 96.6% marks, followed by **Himangi Indora** with 95.2% marks, and **Mehak Srivastava** with 95% marks in the Humanities stream.

In Commerce Stream, **Mehak Malhotra** bagged the 1st position with 94% marks. **Ishaa Gupta** with 92.6 % stood second and **Ashutosh Chaudhary** with 92.4% marks stood third.

Manas Lohani topped the Science stream with an impressive 96.6%, followed by **Chetan Kumar** in second place with 96.2%, and **Nikki Gautam** in third with 95.8%.

Our class XII students have secured admission to various prestigious colleges, and universities as well as professional courses.

Our teaching is inclusive and holistic. Approximately 90% of our student population stays with us for their complete schooling. Students enter in Nursery Class and leave after Class XII. The 10% of the floating population is due to transfers and shifting of families. Unlike many other private schools that take special admissions in Class VI and Class XI to boost results, we try to recognize the potential of children from the initial years and groom them as per their inherent qualities and interests. Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan's Mehta Vidyalaya has been a pioneer in supporting the education of children with special needs. We have 8 special educators, a counselor, and a PGT, Psychology Teacher to support the needs of differential learning. This is the very reason our CWSN

students who appeared in class X and XII CBSE Board exams 2022-23, cleared the examination with flying colours. All the students secured First Division with distinctions in multiple subjects.

Co-curricular activities play a key role in developing diverse mental and personality traits. In a rapidly changing world, traditional education must evolve to align with the principles of NEP 2020. Howard Gardner's *Five Minds for the Future* outlines essential mental abilities for success and happiness:

- **The Disciplinary Mind** – expertise in various subjects
- **The Synthesizing Mind** – problem-solving ability
- **The Creating Mind** – creative thinking and innovation
- **The Respectful Mind** – appreciation of diversity
- **The Ethical Mind** – responsibility beyond self

These concepts highlight the need for education that extends beyond the classroom, preparing students for the challenges of the 21st century.

In recent years, Bhavan's Mehta Vidyalaya has modernized its infrastructure to meet the needs of the 21st-century workforce. We have introduced a state-of-the-art sports campus with international-standard fields and equipment, now available for evening activities. Our new, fully equipped laboratories cater to both fundamental learning and advanced experimentation, with subject-specific labs for senior classes and integrated Science and Math labs for Classes III to VIII. The school also features three computer labs for different grade levels, ensuring all students have access to hands-on learning.

Additionally, we have a high-tech language lab for improving reading, speaking, and writing skills, as well as specialized rooms for dance, carpentry, and robotics, all designed to foster 21st-century skills.

The session 2022-23, witnessed a multitude of prizes being bagged by Mehta Vidyalaya students in co-curricular events and activities. Their achievements have brought laurels to the school. The entire Mehta Vidyalaya fraternity congratulates all these young achievers!

Three students from our school qualified the prestigious MUKHYAMANTRI VIGYAN PRATIBHA PARIKSHA (MVPP) organized by the Directorate of education -

- **Dev Bhadar of Class XII-A** was selected to participate in the National event held at Sports Authority of India under the Khelo India Initiative.
 - **Siddharth of IX-B** was selected to play Vijay Merchant Trophy Cricket tournament at the National Level in January 2023.
 - In Athletic Meet organized by DOE in the year 2023, **Rahul Krishna** won 1 Gold and 2 Silver medals in athletics. **Siddharth Kumar of XI-A** won the Bronze medal and **Aditya Kumar of IX-D** won the silver and bronze medal. Besides this, **Krishna of Class X, Aniket of Class XII, and Vivaan of Class XI** won 3rd position in the Table Tennis Event.
 - The school's IT team is innovative and dynamic, creating a learning environment

that adapts to technological advancements. We are fully equipped to transition to online learning when needed, with classrooms evolving to meet the demands of modern digital learners. Guided by expert faculty, our students lead National and International competitions, including the Dewang Mehta IT competition, now hosted at these levels by our Techedge and Techbotic clubs. This year, we also organized a virtual Science Exhibition for Bhavan's schools nationwide and abroad. Additionally, the Kalam Robotic Club fosters creativity, developing robotics and AI skills in students.

- The project STEM has been introduced in school to enhance technical skills among girl students in collaboration with Ernst and Young on a global level.
- The project Muskan is a CSR Project in collaboration with Rolls Royce to enhance technical learning amongst CWSN students. Our children enthusiastically take part in several technology-based competitions.
- **Adhyan Rastogi** and **Tanvi Sharma** won 2nd position in the Augmented video competition held at IPS, Dwarka. **Tiya Sharma** won 3rd position in the Personnage event organized by G D Goenka School, Delhi.
- Dance, Music, painting and carpentry and Skill Education have a special place in our curriculum. 'Kala Naipunya Club' provides a hands-on experience to students through skill education.
- In DOE Zonal dance competition held on 1 Sept 2023, **Sompurno Chowdhary** and **Nanadana Jaichandran** won first and third position respectively in Kathak and Bharatanatyam dance competitions.

- Students also participated in the DOE Zonal Instrumental and Percussion competition, bringing pride to the school with their outstanding performances:
- **Daksh** (Class 8C) secured 1st position in Tabla.
- **Sanskar, Koyal, Shruti, and Sarthak Srivastava** achieved top positions in Harmonium.
- Students also participated in DOE Zonal Classical (Solo) Vocal and On-the-spot Painting Competitions and our students- **Bhuvnesh, Anvita, and Debankon** got top positions.
- A very proud moment for the School was when 11 students of class X to XII participated in the “Nadi” (Rivers) Utsav- Painting competition organized by IGNSA and all the 11 paintings were selected and displayed at the IGNSA gallery.
- To foster quality learning and enable students to evaluate their performance against peers nationally and globally, the school organizes various National and International Olympiads in all subjects.
- 9 students have won Gold Medals, 9 have won Silver medals and 9 have won Bronze medals in the International level Informatics Olympiad 2022-23.
- In the International Olympiad of English a total of 204 students from classes III to XII participated in Level 1 of the Olympiad. We are delighted to inform you that 12 students participated in the International Olympiad of English Language (English-Level 2) competing with their counterparts across the world. The English department has also initiated a new project - the Pen Literacy Program. The main goal of this

pilot Pen Literacy Program is to complement classroom teaching by further strengthening the foundational reading and writing skills of students also recommended by NEP-2020.

The school believes in the School Parent Partnership Module and therefore organized several Parents’ Orientation Programme for all classes during this academic year. The purpose of these sessions was to brief and acquaint Parents with the new curriculum in accordance with NEP 2020.

With the guidance of our Manager, Dr. C.K. Arya, Retd. Principal, Kendriya Vidyalaya and Principal of Bhavan’s Sankaracharya Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya, the school is promoting the learning of Sanskrit in Classes VI to VIII and as an option subject in Classes XI & XII. Additionally, students also learn Sanskrit through a specially designed curriculum by Bhavan’s Saral Sanskrit Pariksha Vibhag, Mumbai. Our students have excelled in Sanskrit and have won scholarships instituted by Central Sanskrit University.

The school has a dedicated Counselor and Post Graduate Teacher in Psychology. Regular counseling sessions are held for students and parents on various relevant topics like career counseling, time management, emotional intelligence, stress management, dealing with Exam Anxiety, Mental Health etc. These sessions are taken by the School Counselor and various guest speakers from respective fields. Recently School organized a Career Fair for students and Parents of Classes XI & XII in the school campus. More than 22 prestigious universities visited the campus and guided students about their programmes, scholarships and admission process. Students of neighbouring schools benefitted by joining the Career Fair.

School is also committed to make the educational process inclusive of Value Education and Life skills. Therefore it runs Awakened

Citizen Value-based education module designed by Ramakrishna Mission for classes I to VIII. The programme stresses on man-making & character building.

At Mehta Vidyalaya, we are committed to fostering humanitarian values and community service. In partnership with the Robin Hood Army (RHA), we launched the Roti Bank on 7 July, 2023. Every Friday, students from Nursery to Class XII voluntarily donate extra chapattis for those in need. This initiative supports the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals of "Zero Hunger" and "Good Health and Well-being," aiming to help eliminate starvation in society.

The International Cultural Exchange Program broadens students' global perspectives, helping them adapt to new cultures and fostering a liberal mindset. The school has partnered with several countries for this initiative, and in collaboration with the Embassy of Korea, we have introduced Taekwondo classes and Korean language courses at Mehta Vidyalaya.

I feel immensely proud to share some of our achievements.

- I was honoured to be selected as a member of a delegation comprising 20 selected school heads and representatives from India, supported by the Ministry of Education, Taiwan, and the Taipei Economic & Cultural Centre New Delhi. The delegation, including myself, recently visited Taiwan for an intensive 5-day exchange program. The visit aimed to foster collaboration and gain invaluable insights into Taiwan's innovative educational pedagogy, enhancing global learning experiences.
- In September 2023, I was selected by the Australian High Commission to participate in the *Women in School Leadership*

program, organized by the Asia Education Foundation in partnership with the Australia India Institute and Melbourne Graduate School of Education. This program brought together 20 school principals from Delhi and 20 from Victoria, focusing on leading schools for social change, with an emphasis on health, well-being, and the empowerment of girls. Following a one-week immersion, a collaborative case study project between Victorian and Indian schools will lead the initiative for 2023-24.

- Dr. Jyoti Dev Rishi (School Counselor) and Mrs. Aradhana Gambhir (PGT, Psychology) received Certificates of Appreciation from NCERT for their support and counseling under *MANODARPAN*, an initiative by the Ministry of Education, Govt of India, addressing mental health concerns during the COVID-19 pandemic and beyond.

Rs. 11,000 award for a needy and meritorious primary student in memory of his in-laws, Smt. Suraj Rani and Shri Anand Swaroop Bhargava. Additionally, an award of Rs. 25,000 per year has been set up by his daughter, Ms. Pooja, and son-in-law, Mr. Manish, in memory of Dr. Daya Narayan Nigam. The Chairman of Delhi Kendra, Shri. Gharekhan, has created an annual Rs. 5,000 award for Excellence in Music, supported by a corpus of Rs. 1 lakh.

We appreciate the noble gesture of eminent persons involved with Bhavans and its ideals and have instituted the cash award and scholarship to acknowledge the efforts of the students in academics as well as co-curricular activities. I thank each donor for this kind act in support of learning.

Manjit Singh Rana, President of the Bhavanites Association, Mr. Anoop Sharma, Secretary, and Mr. Manish Ahuja, Treasurer for their active role in revitalizing the Alumni Association.

I sincerely appreciate the Parent Teachers Association for their support and guidance in school activities, honouring teachers and providing financial assistance to needy students.

I leave you with these words by Ann Landers, a famous columnist and media person.

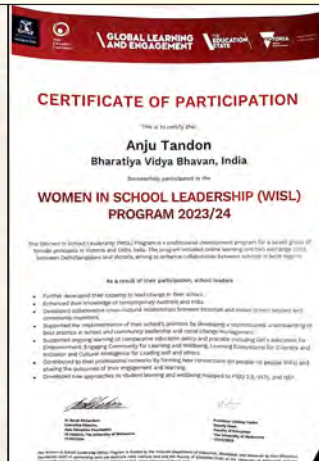

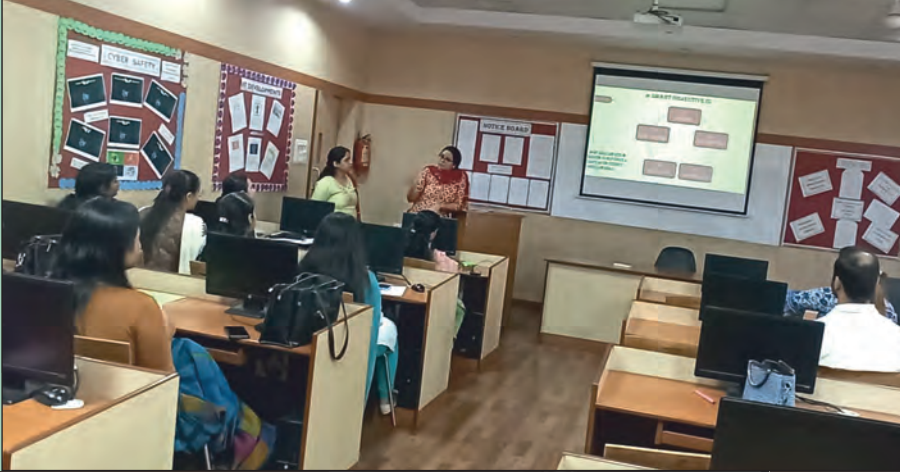

Parent Orientation Programme

Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan's Mehta Vidyalaya conducted a series of Parent Orientation Programmes for Nursery, Class I, Class III, Class V, Classes VII & VIII, and Class XI during March and April 2023. In-House Capacity Building Programme - 2023

Mehta Vidyalaya organized an In-House Capacity Building Programme (CBP) for its teaching staff from May 15 to May 23, 2023. The Programme aimed to enhance the professional skills of educators and keep them updated with the latest educational developments.

The first session, led by the school principal, Dr. (Mrs.) Anju Tandon focused on Bhavan's rich history, philosophy, vision, and mission. Throughout the CBP, various nominated teachers from different departments served as resource persons, covering crucial topics such as 'Disaster Management,' 'Exploring 21st Century Skills,' 'SQA' and 'Bloom's Taxonomy'.

A key highlight was a training session conducted by a team from Silver Zone, New Delhi, which provided insights into the salient features of the NEP 2020 and the National Curriculum Framework (NCF).

Other vital sessions included 'Pedagogy in Teaching,' 'Identifying Students with Special Needs,' where school counselor Dr. Jyoti Dev Rishi introduced PRASHAST, a disability screening checklist in alignment with the RPWD Act 2016. Additionally, the 'Happiness Curriculum' and 'Awakened Citizenship Programme' were explored, emphasizing value education and holistic development.



INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE PROGRAM

As a part of the ongoing International Cultural Exchange Programme, the following activities are being conducted through ties and collaborations, under the able coordinatorship of Mrs. Aradhana Gambhir.

INDO-TAIWAN EXCHANGE PROGRAMME

Principal's Visit To TAIWAN

A delegation of twenty principals and seven representatives of Indian schools visited Taiwan on a 6-day historical learning tour between 20th May and 25th May, 2023. This first-ever such visit was supported by Taiwan's Ministry of Education and by the Taipei Economic and Cultural Centre in New Delhi. The purpose of the visit was to foster international collaboration and for the delegation to explore Taiwan's educational pedagogy related to global learning experiences.

The itinerary for the visitors was organized by the Education Division of the Taipei Economic and Cultural Center (TECC) in India. It was designed to allow the delegation to experience Taiwan's dynamic education system during their stay in Taiwan. In particular they observed how Taiwan has effectively mainstreamed vocational education and the training of entrepreneurs, and the effective use of technology in education that are hallmarks of Taiwan's education system.

The delegation visited the Ministry of Education, and partner schools in different parts of Taiwan including Taipei Municipal Wenhua Elementary School, Wen-Hua Senior High School in Taichung, and National Puli Industrial Vocational High School, and engaged in fruitful exchanges.

At the schools, they attended presentation sessions, observed classroom teaching, and engaged in discussions with the teachers and the students, giving them valuable insights into Taiwan's student-centered approach. The delegation also visited prominent cultural institutions, such as the National Museum of Marine Science and Technology, the National Palace Museum, and the Kaohsiung Public Library.



A memorandum of understanding signed between schools in India and Taiwan has strengthened the educational ties between India and Taiwan, and this visit and the cross-cultural exchanges have laid the foundation for further long-lasting collaborations.

The delegation attended a **thanksgiving ceremony** held on 31st May at Hotel Shangri-La Eros, New Delhi. Mr. Chen Li-ying, the Director of the Education Division of the TECC in India, spoke at the ceremony, saying, “This visit was a grand success and a milestone that has helped strengthen the ties between India and Taiwan in the field of education. The delegation returned to India with a renewed vision and determination to implement the knowledge and insight they gained from this educational tour.

”Fostering Global Connections with Siihou Elementary School, Taiwan

Following the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) signed with the Principal of Sijhou Elementary School, Taiwan, our Class VI students engaged in a productive interaction with Taiwanese students on November 7, 2023. This program was well-received by both schools and parents. It empowered our students to share their valuable insights and cultural perspectives.



INDO – KOREA EXCHANGE PROGRAMME

Cultivating Discipline and Fitness: A Taekwondo Program

Mehta Vidyalaya, in collaboration with the Korean Cultural Centre, launched a comprehensive Taekwondo program for students of Classes VI to VIII, commencing on 1st May, 2023. Thirty-five enthusiastic students participated in intensive training sessions, held four days a week (Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday) for one hour each.

This program was designed to enhance students’ physical fitness, agility, and self-defense skills. Through rigorous training, students developed self-discipline, improved muscle tone, stamina, and flexibility, and honed their focus and concentration. Additionally, the program provided valuable tools for effective stress management.



Enhancing Global Perspectives: Korean Language Course at Mehta Vidyalaya

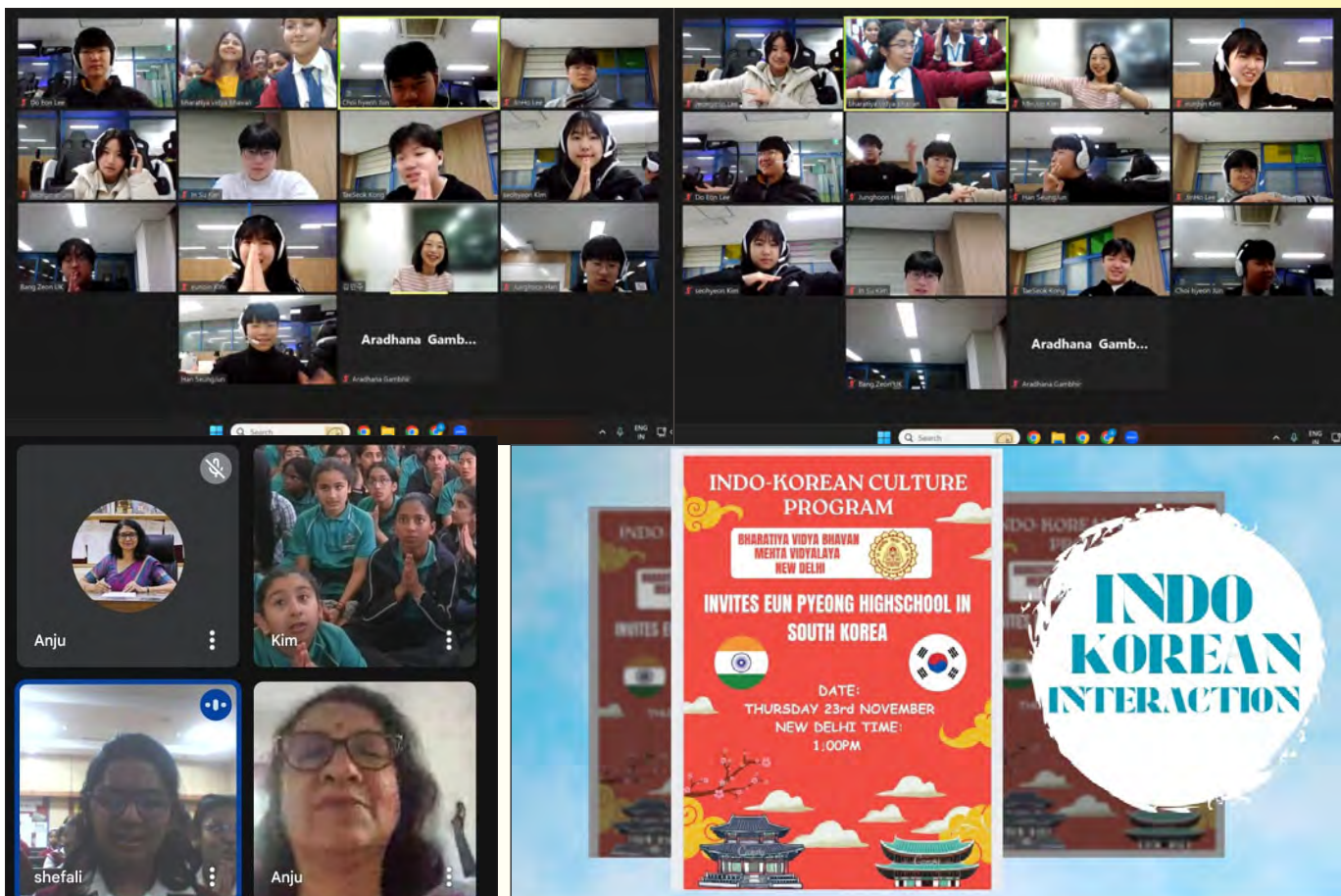

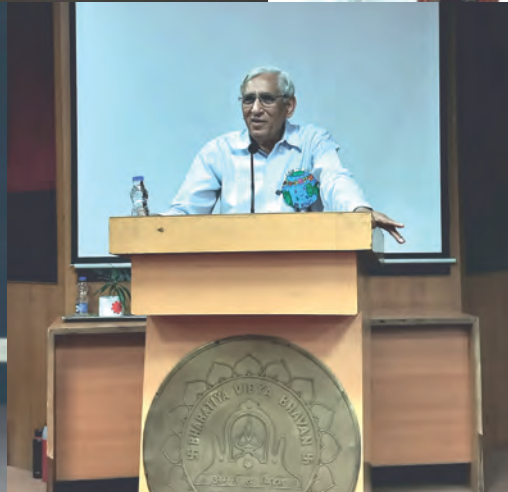


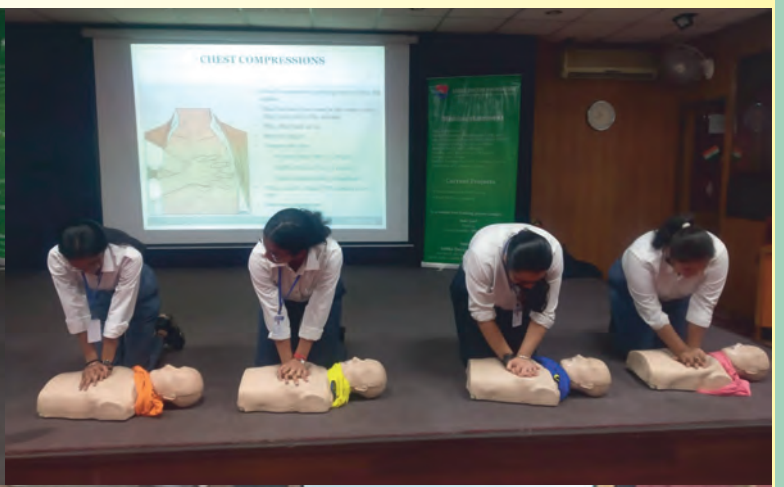
SAS Camp

Ms. Aparna Singh also highlighted key **constitutional provisions** such as **Articles 14, 15, 21, 21A, 23, and 24**, ensuring participants understood the legal foundations protecting children's rights.

The workshop detailed offenses under the **POCSO Act**, including **sexual assault, harassment, pornography involvement, abetment, and attempted offenses**. Ms. Singh shared practical strategies for identifying and addressing such cases.

A significant portion of the training focused on the **Visakha Guidelines**, clarifying acceptable and unacceptable workplace behavior and encouraging staff to maintain a safe and supportive

environment. Overall, the session equipped the staff with essential knowledge and skills to protect children's rights and well-being, making it an invaluable experience for all attendees.

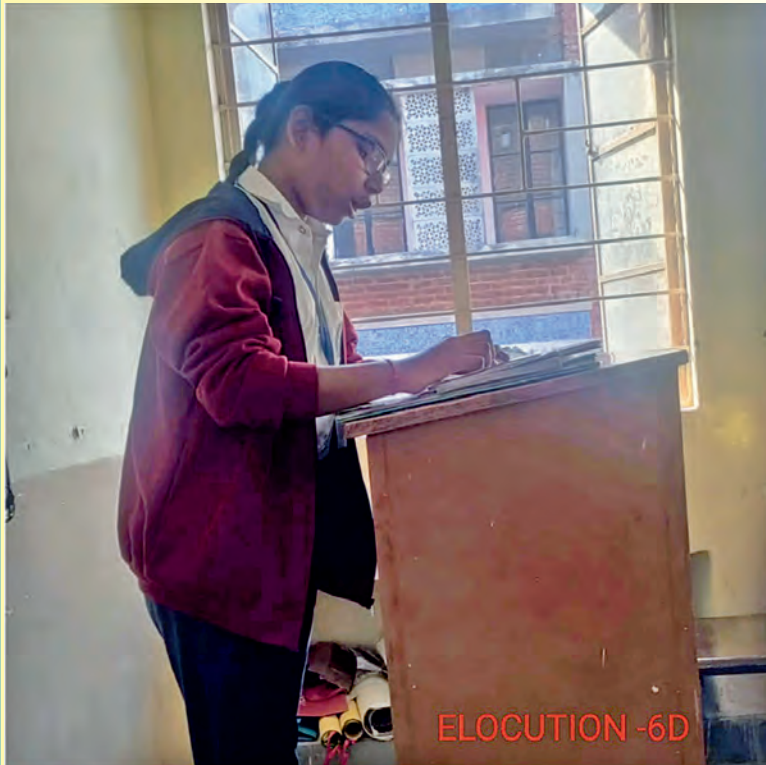
HAPPINESS CURRICULUM

I would like to conclude with the quotation of C.S.Lewis:

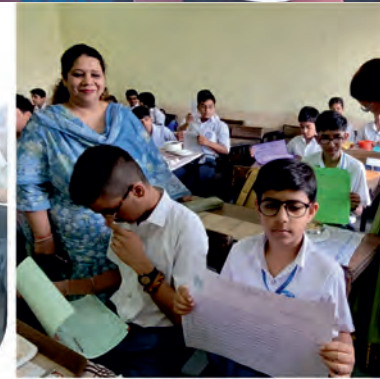

SWATCHTA ABHIYAN

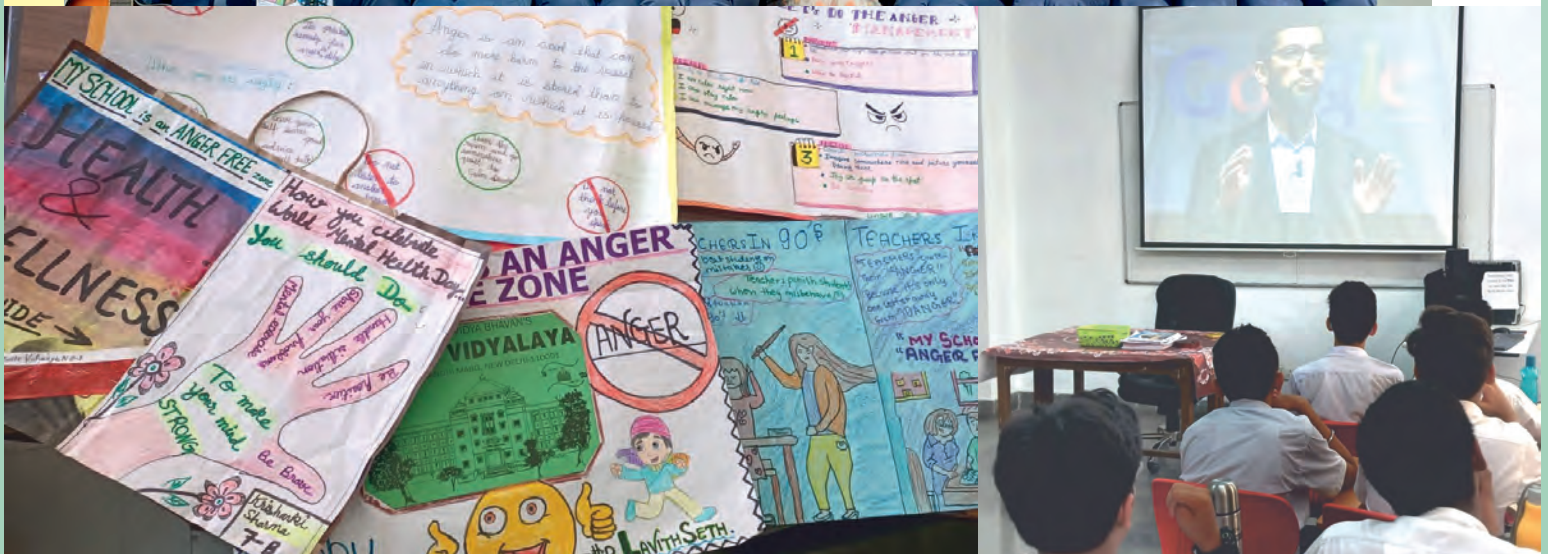

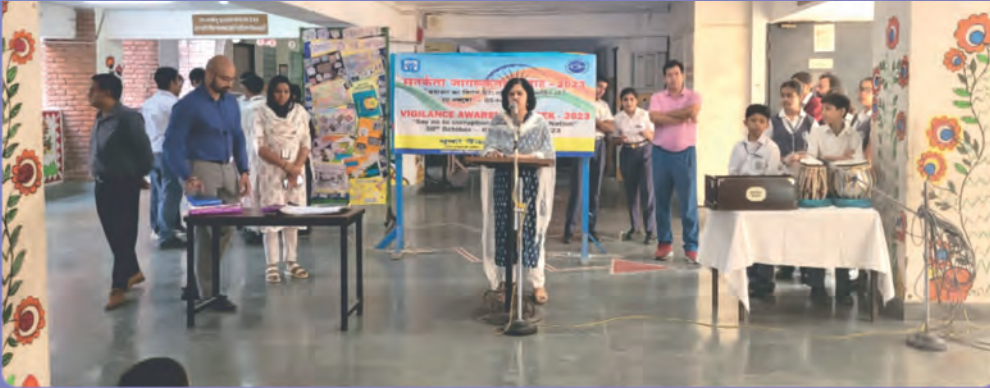

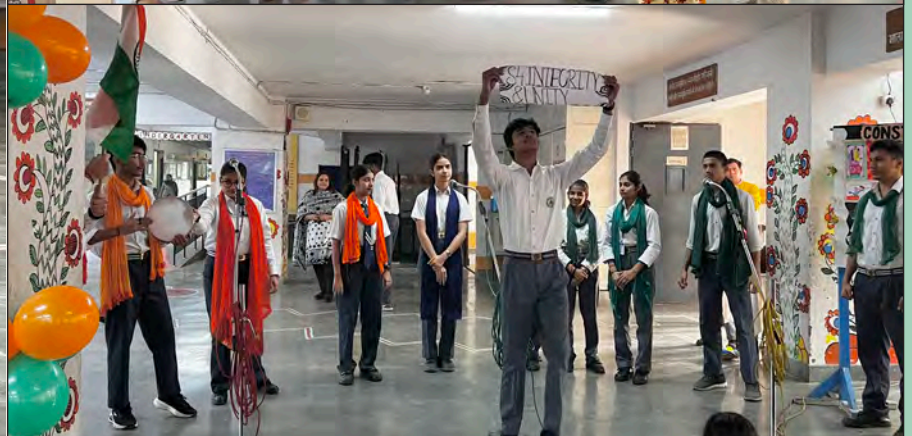
ANNUAL ATHLETIC MEET-2023

AWAKENED CITIZEN PROGRAM (ACP) & AWAKENING PROGRAM (AP)

Value-based education is crucial in shaping a socially aware and prepared generation for the future.



At Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan's Mehta Vidyalaya, we recognize the significance of imparting such education. Hence, we have introduced the Awakened Citizen Program (ACP) since 2015 as a graded three-year value education program tailored for middle school students in grades VI to VIII. This academic session we also introduced Awakening Program (AP) as a feeder program of ACP for primary students from grades I to V. Awakening Program is an initiative towards ensuring overall personality development of a child in line with the philosophy of National Education Policy (NEP) 2020.

The new session classes of ACP began from 10 April 2023 using approaches such as discussion-based learning and self-discovery. This program integrates concepts like 'atmashraddha' (self-respect) to help students understand the challenges of life, realize their potential, make responsible choices and find solutions for all problems of life.

Through interactive sessions, students engage in thoughtful discussions on moral dilemmas, social issues, and personal development through real life situations and case studies for reflections. They reflect on their values, strengths, and weaknesses, fostering a deeper understanding of themselves and others. The program encourages critical thinking and empathy, preparing students to navigate real-life challenges with resilience and integrity.

The Awakening Program sessions involve story-telling as a major tool which gives each child an opportunity to **Explore, Find, Choose and Adopt** values voluntarily in an environment moderated by the trained AP facilitator. Students also engage in simple, fun activities both at school and home that allow children or them to internalize the values they explored.

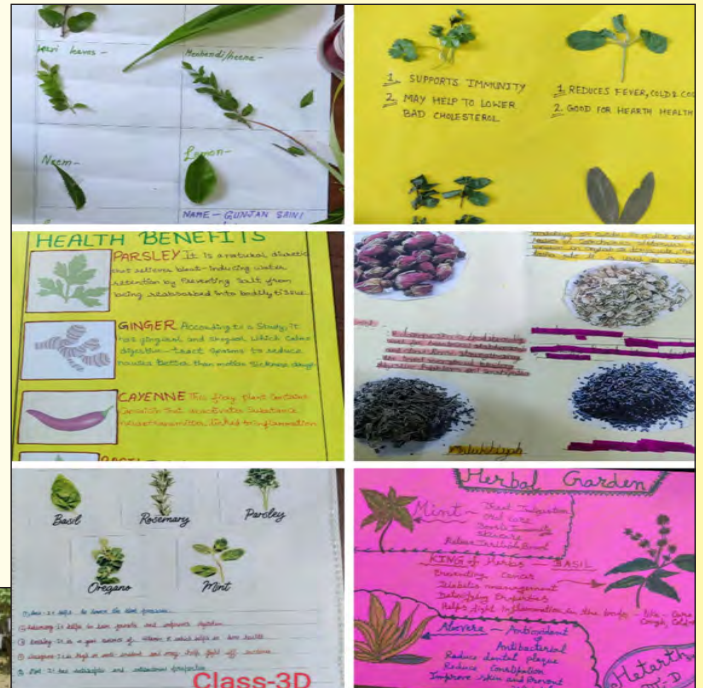
Herbal Garden Club: Nurturing Nature, Nourishing Minds

Features and Key Strengths:

A standout feature of the programme was its promotion of autonomous learning. Students progressed at their own pace, encouraging independent practice and ownership of their education. This self-directed approach fostered confidence and competence in reading, writing, and comprehension skills.



By Progress Check 2, BVB students demonstrated an overall improvement of 2.52 points on a 20-point scale. The average score increased from 7.39 points in Progress Check 1, corresponding to A2 on the CEFR, to 9.51 points in Progress Check 2, reflecting B1-level proficiency. This improvement signifies a notable enhancement in the English proficiency of BVBMV students throughout the programme.

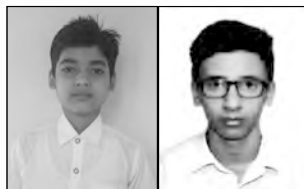

Super Kiddos Day Activity

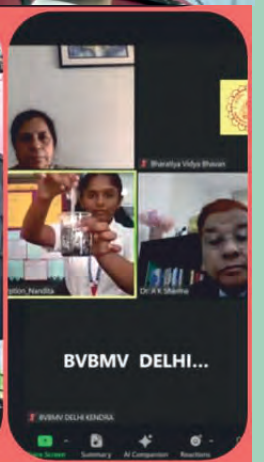
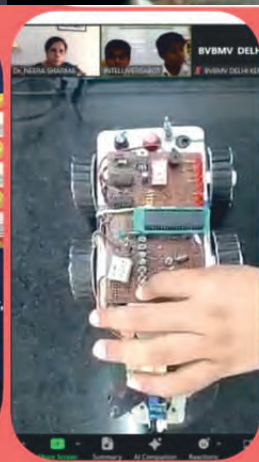

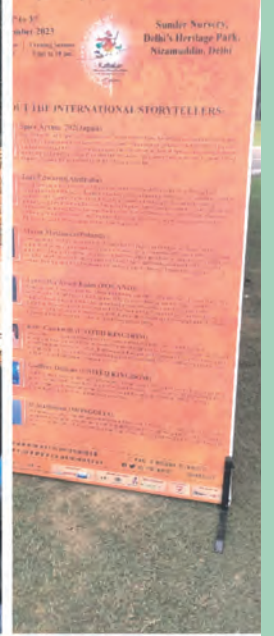


Students' Workshops

- The 3rd All India Bhavan's Virtual Science Exhibition, VIGYAN YATRA 2023, hosted by

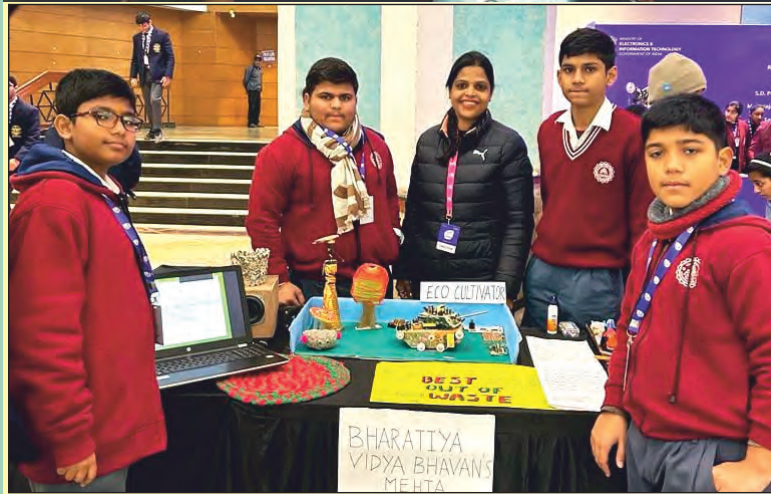

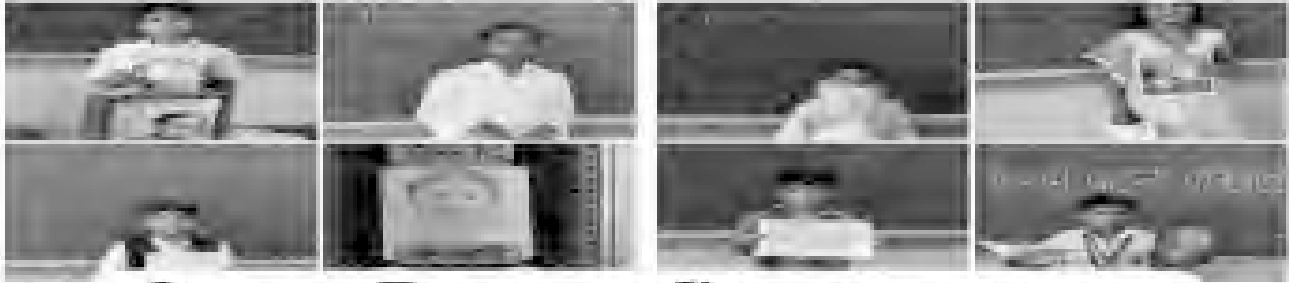
